<b>Project Name</b>	<b>Project Description</b>
(Also non-motorized) Timber Trails ATV Co-op - Refurbish Bridges	Production of trail system map to be distributed at trade shows, upgrade existing trail system and lengthen adjoining trails, purchase trail identification signs, refurbish 3 bridges on acquired "caribou trail."
St. Walburg ATV Trail	Clean-up existing trails by filling in pot holes and digging out rocks, for safety reasons. Build bridges to protect water from machines and to improve accessibility for hikers and cyclists.
Saskatchewan All Terrain Vehicle Association - Rehabilitation and Surveying	A province wide project including surveying trails, trail maintenance and rehabilitation, future signage for fall 2009 and trail grooming equipment. All of these will serve the purpose of upgrading trails.
Archerwill Drift Riders - ATV Trail	Construction of a permanent rally trail that will be wide enough for volunteer club members to access with small equipment to maintain the trail. A parking lot will be constructed to accommodate vehicles and trailers.
Moose Mountain Mudders	Trail Upgrade and new trails

(also Snowmobile and ATV) Tansi TCT Assoc Inc. - Completion of TCT	Completion of the TCTrail from the junction of Highways #35 and #56, through the Standing Buffalo Reserve and Echo Valley Prov. Park.
Great Plains TCT Assoc. - Lumsden/Deer Valley TCT Upgrade	Develop and implement an integrated mapping and signage system for 17 km section of TCTrail in Lumsden/Deer Valley area.
Meewasin Valley Authority	4.1 km of recreational trail will be built to be used year round. Construction includes survey, grading, aggregate trail base and asphalt surface, timber edging, and native seed mix to repair areas around construction.

Wascana Centre Authority - Enhanced Signage and Striping Project	Providing signage at the 21 entry points to the trails and 11 pathway signs at appropriate intervals. The project also includes adding striping to the centre of entire trail to guide trail users, and to improve the overall safety of multi-purpose trail.
(also Snowmobile) Ministry of Tourism - Meadow Lake Prov. Pk trail system	Develop a park-wide hiking/backpacking trail system, with a route designed to minimize impact and utilize existing trails as much as possible. Back country sites will be established with Leave No Trace principles in mind.
City of Moose Jaw - 2009 Trail Enhancements	Trail enhancements that would involve recapping, rebuilding and adding a new section of trail for combined length of approximately 900m.
City of Weyburn/Tatagwa Parkway	Planning to construct 1.6 km of new paved trail in narrow Parkway corridor along north perimeter of city, and an additional 1 km of paved trail in New Silver heights Pkwy in NE. Also planting approx. 300 caliper trees and installing benches at regular intervals.
Ministry of Tourism, Parks, Culture, Sport - Nut Point Hiking Trail	Clear rest of 15km trail of deadfall and hazardous trees, gravel parking lot and low lying areas along access roads to the trail, replace/repair existing boardwalks along trail.
City of Humboldt - Walking Trail Development	Develop 400 km of trail that extends around Water Ridge Park, connecting to the existing trail system. Park signage is needed. Centennial Park master plan includes 2.4 km <sup>2</sup> of walking trail around 49 acre park, a 400m trail.
Horizons Unlimited/Churchill River Canoe Outfitters - Northern Canoe Routes	Maintaining (clearing) northern SK canoe routes and documenting their current status.
Friends of Cypress Hills Park, Inc. - Cypress Hills Woodland Trail	Paving a portion of an existing pedestrian pathway (Woodlands Trail) within Cypress Hills Interprovincial Park.
Ministry of Tourism/Parks etc. - Anglin Lake Hiking/Skiing trails	Widen Anglin Lake Hiking/Ski Trails for easy grooming; remove underbrush/small trees for approx 1.5 m on each side of trail to max. of 5m; upgrade trails by filling in low lying spots that get flooded during wet periods to allow for better hiking conditions.
White Butte Trails Recreation Site - Trail Expansion	On-site delineation of additional trail, as well as brushing, mowing and tree trimming. A new trailhead sign and nine trail marker signs would be designed, constructed and installed. Existing trail map brochure would be updated.
Wascana Valley Natural Area - Hiking/Mnt Bike Trail Signs and Map	GPS'ing existing trails; design, development, construction and installation of a new trailhead sign and 15 trail marker signs; and design and printing of a new trail map brochure.

Buffalo Pound Provincial Park - Planning Design TCT Link	To route the TCT through to NW end of Buffalo Pound P.P., which will be linked to existing Dyke Trail in the Park. Contracting a landscape architect firm to conduct on-site assessment of terrain and potential routes to ensure env. disturbance is kept to minimum.
Buffalo Pound Provincial Park - Mnt Bike Trail Signs and Map	The design, development, construction, and installation of the three new trailhead signs, 19, trail name signs, and 20 junction signs, and also to design and print a new trail map and brochure.
Ministry of Tourism/Parks/Culture/Sport - Narrow Hills/Gem Lake Hiking Trail	Add 3 interpretive signs and 1 large trail map to better direct hikers and provide info on park ecology, fire history and boreal birds.
Community Based Planning - Pasqua First Nation Independent Living	Development of the Pasqua Independent Living Complex.
