Trail Status: Operational

Location: Danielson Provincial Park is located in southwest Saskatchewan along Highway 44.

Description: Danielson Provincial Park is situated along the eastern shore of Lake Diefenbaker, which is 225 km long.

The Danielson section of the Trans Canada Trail passes through the provincial park and connects the communities of Outlook and Elbow, Saskatchewan.

A variety of wildlife can be seen along the Danielson section of the TCT, including mule and white tail deer, sharp-tail grouse, and western meadowlarks.

Historical: Lake Diefenbaker was formed in 1967 from the creation of the Gardner and Qu'Appelle Dams.

Terrain: Rural trail

Difficulty: Easy
